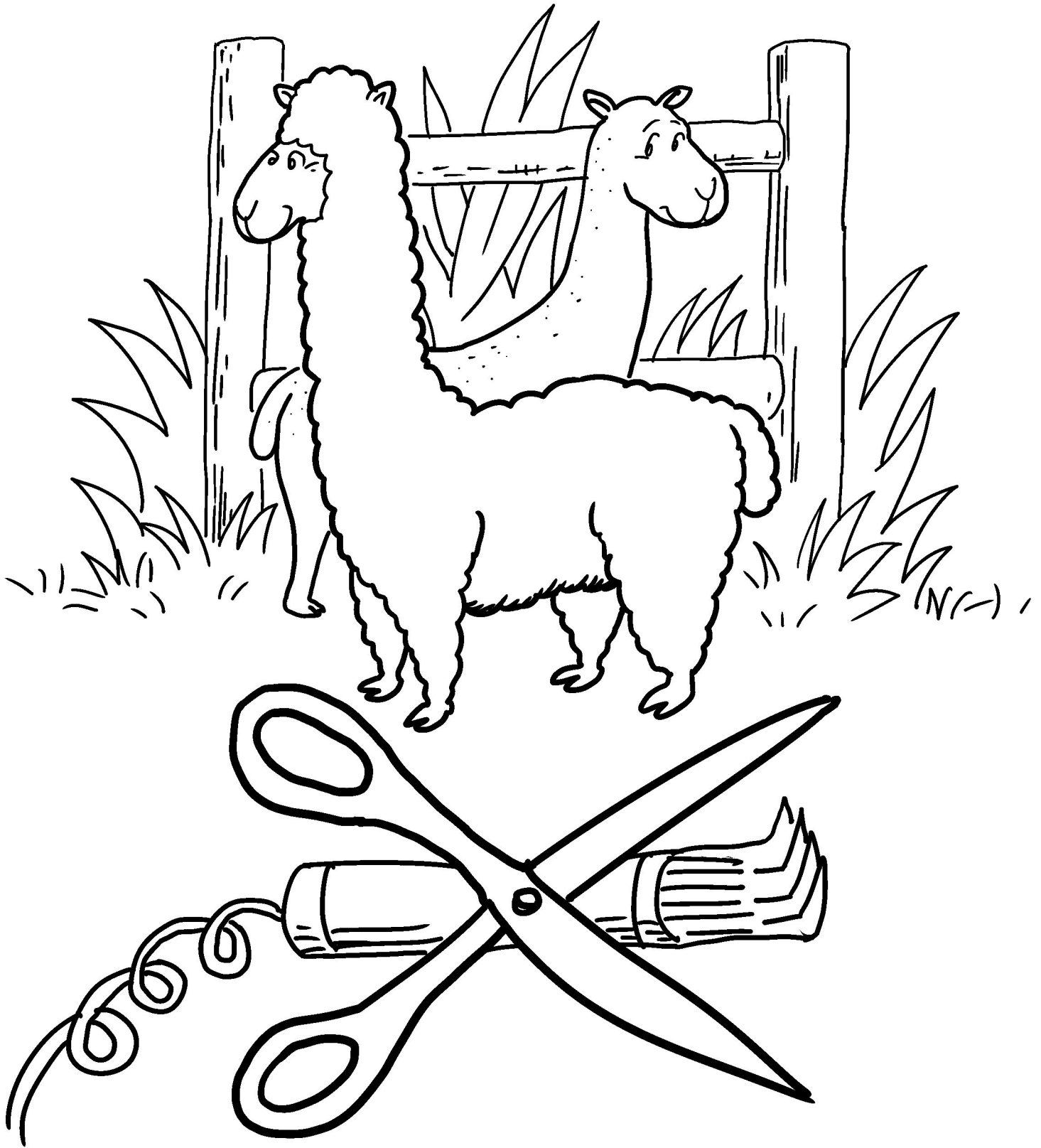


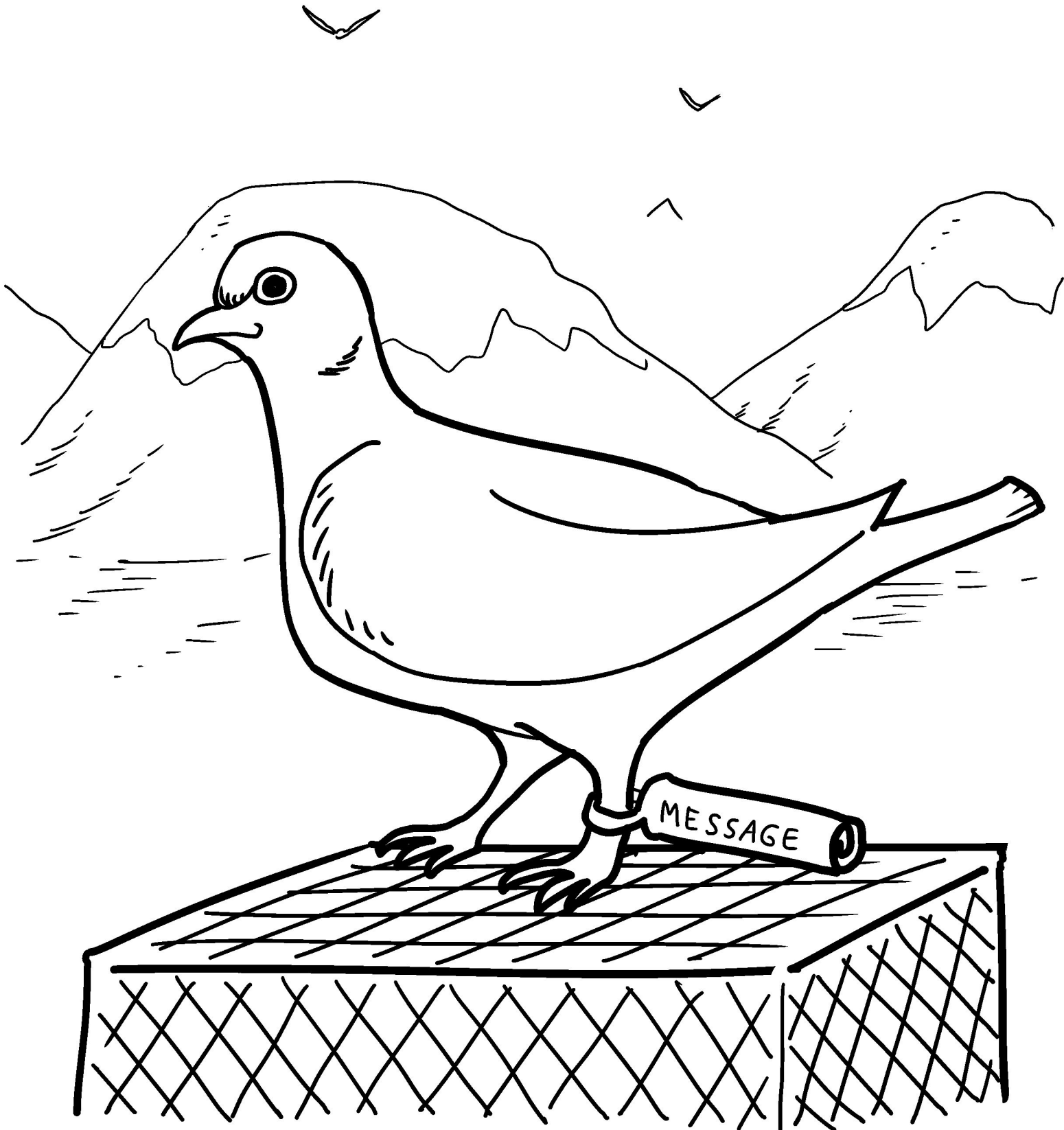
Some Animals Have Jobs



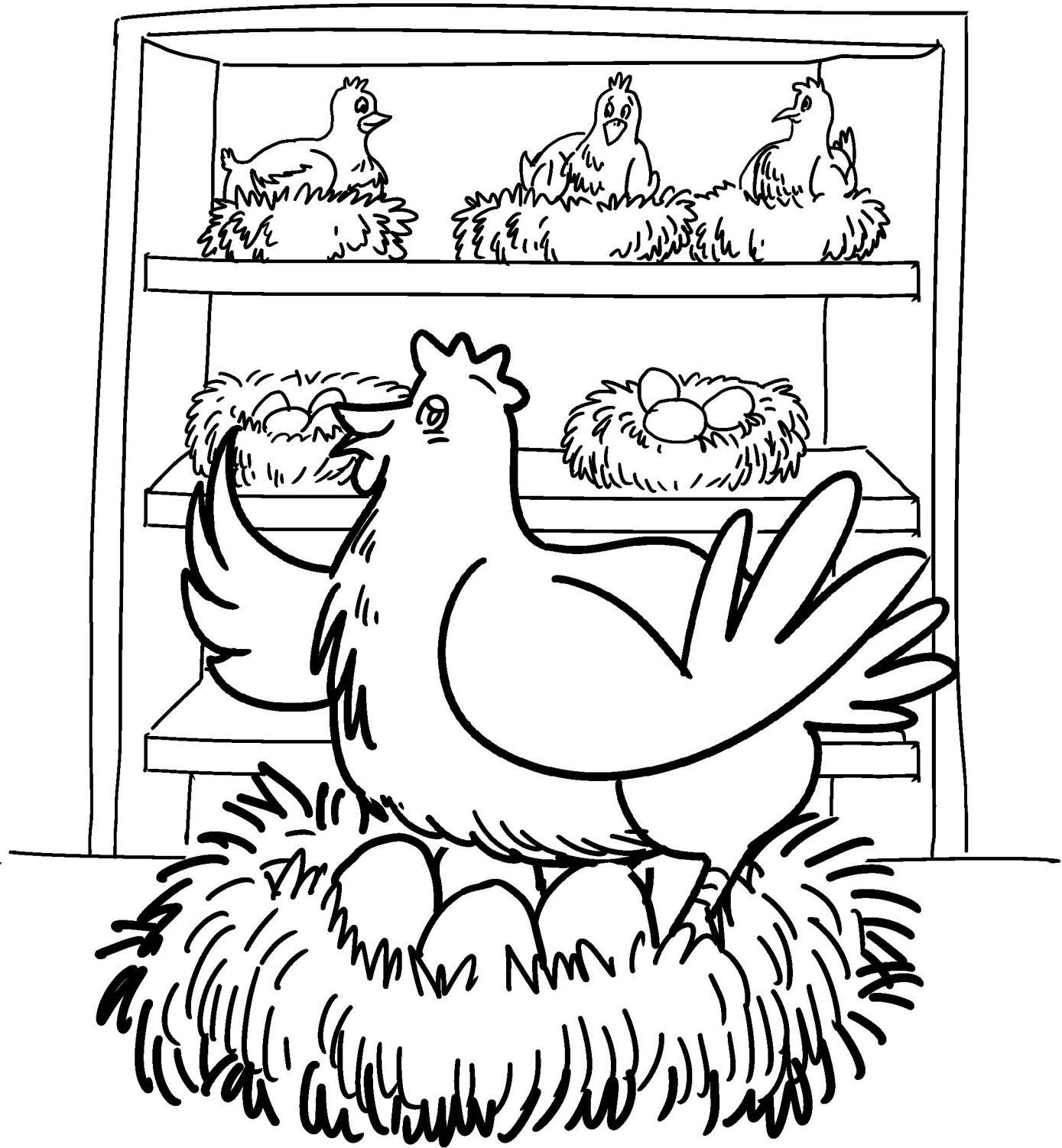


Alpacas give us fleece to make warm sweaters and scarves.

Carrier pigeons delivered messages before we had technology like telegraphs and telephones.



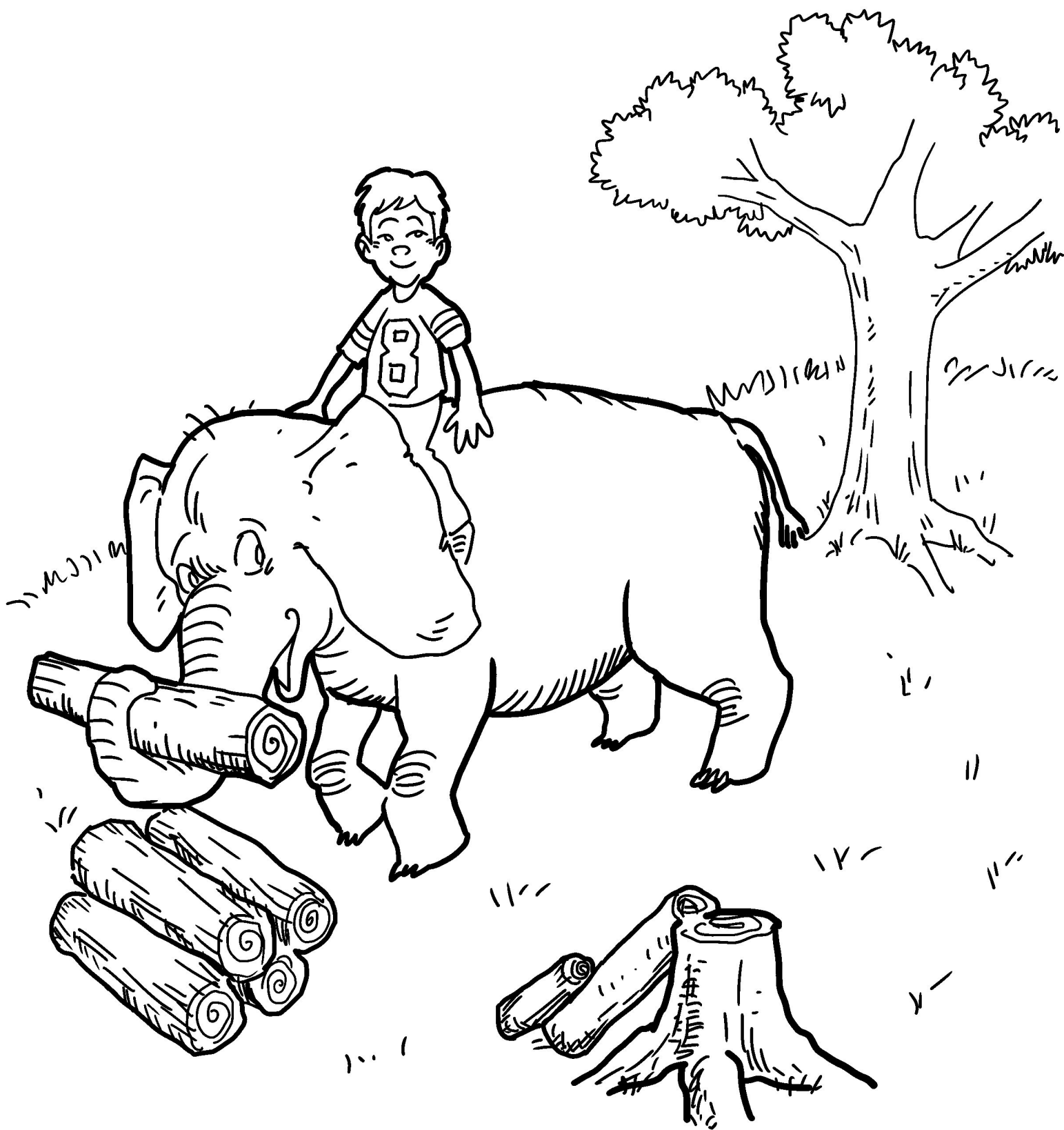
**Chickens give us eggs.
We also eat chicken meat.**



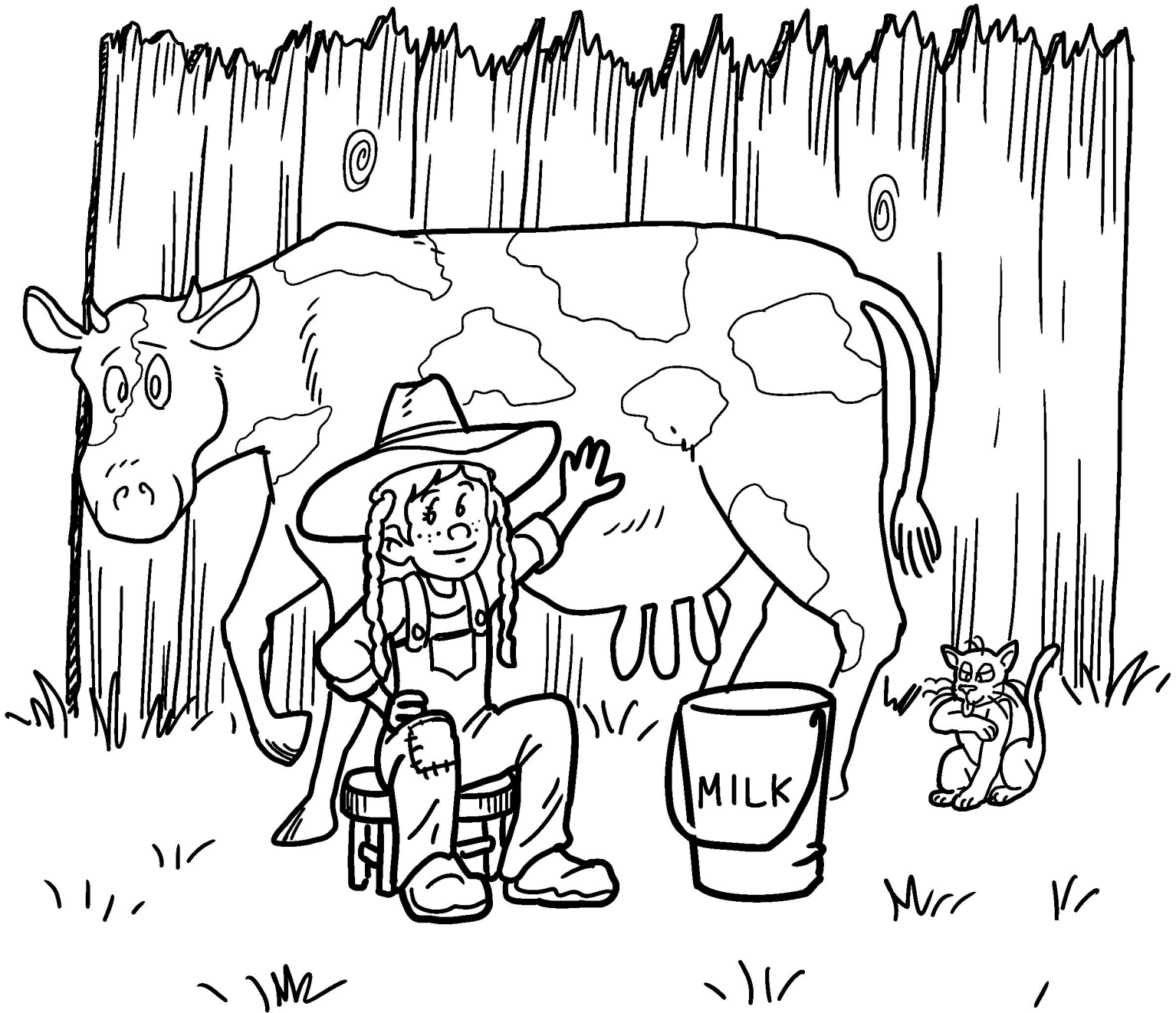
**Some children have a pony for a pet.

Have you ever had a pony ride?**



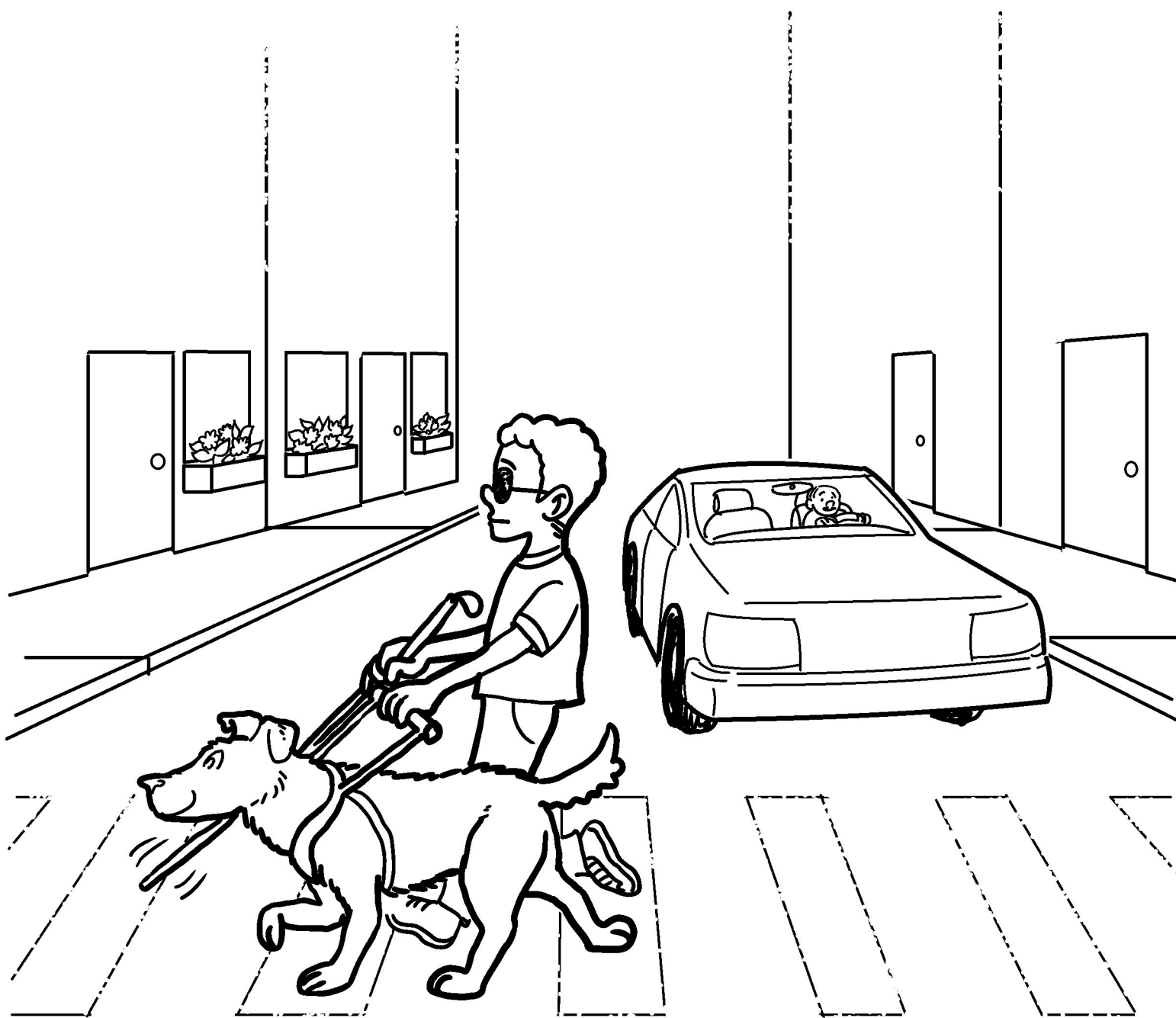
Dalmatians protect the fire truck while the firemen are fighting the fire.

Dairy cows give us milk. One dairy cow can produce 8 gallons of milk per day.



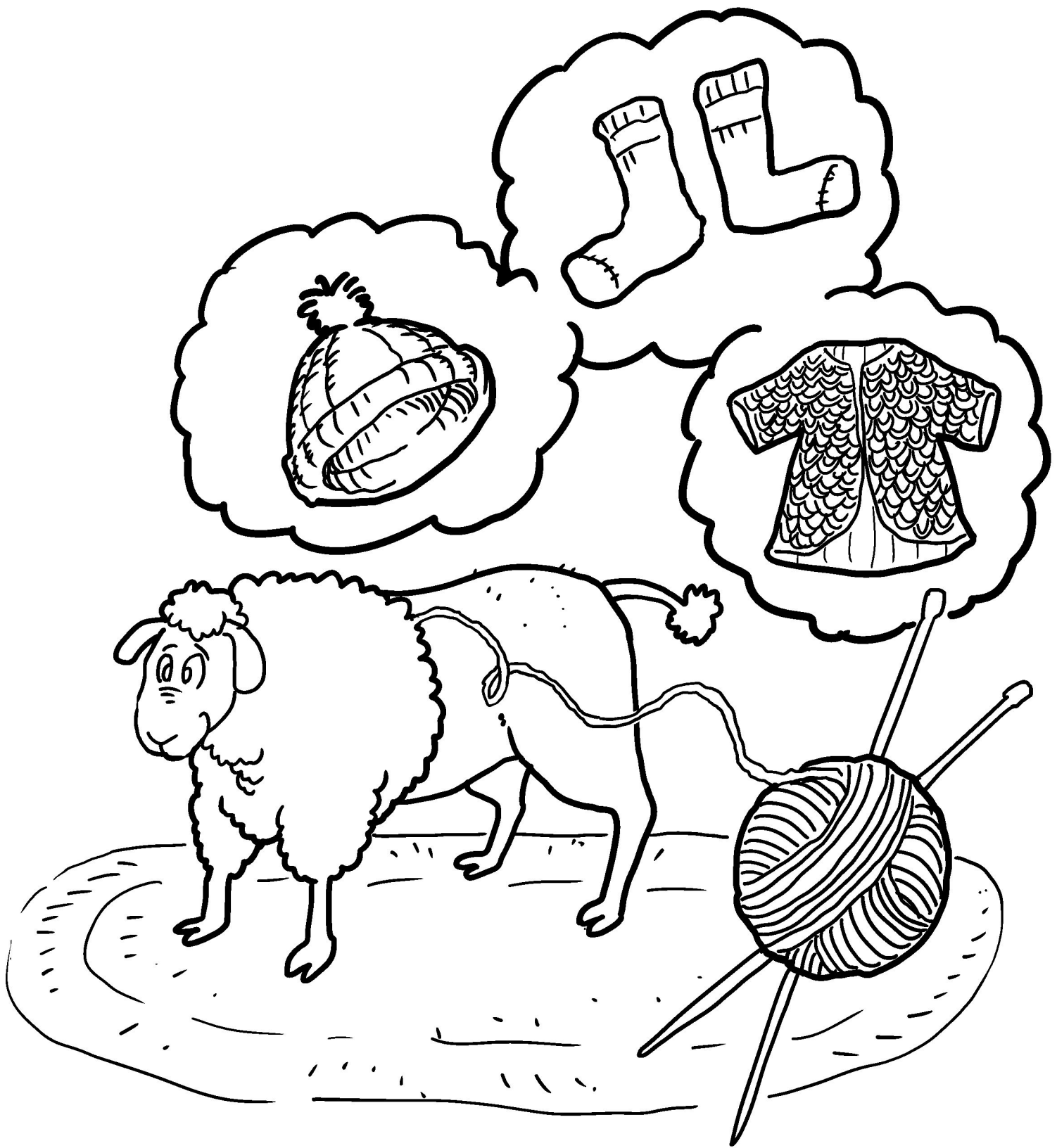
Seeing-eye dogs help the blind get around. They typically work for about 8 years and cost a lot of money to train.



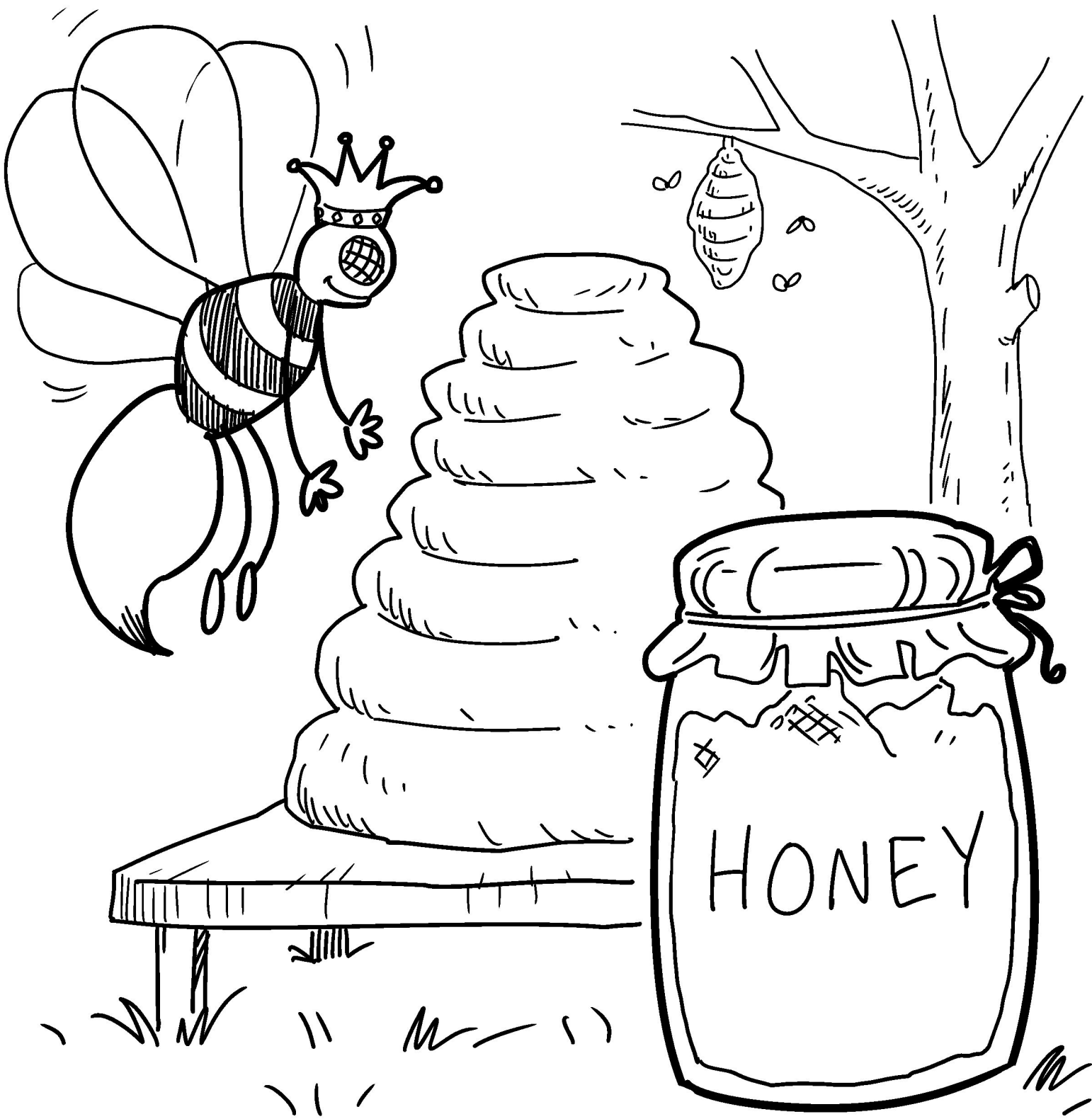
Ducks give us eggs and meat as well. Many countries have duck farms and prefer to eat their eggs over chicken eggs because the yolk is richer.



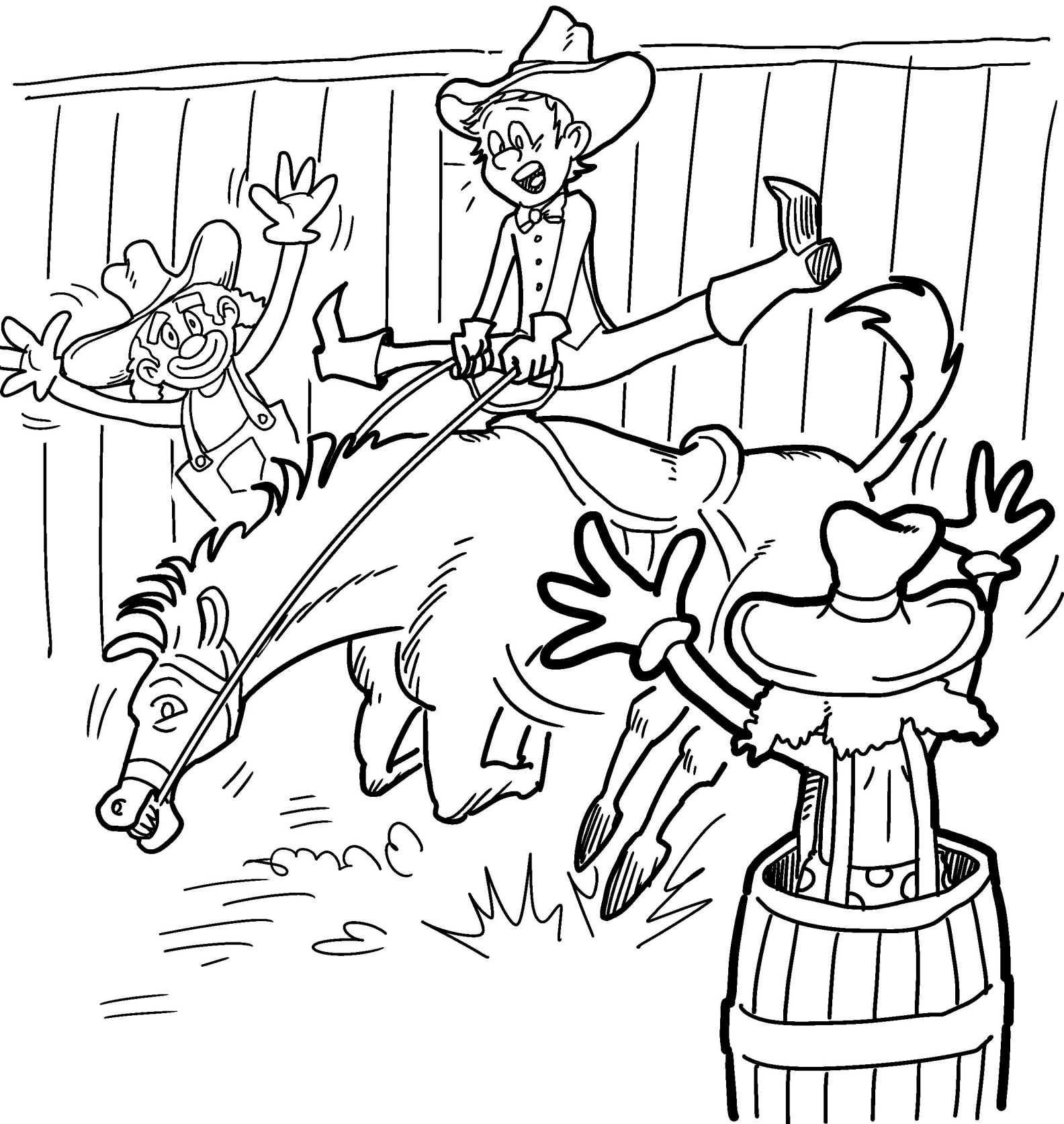
K-9s also work with their noses. You may have seen one in an airport sniffing for hidden dangers. They can smell 40 times better than you.

Bees work very hard to give us honey and beeswax. There can be anywhere from 10,000 to 80,000 bees in a hive. What do we make out of beeswax?



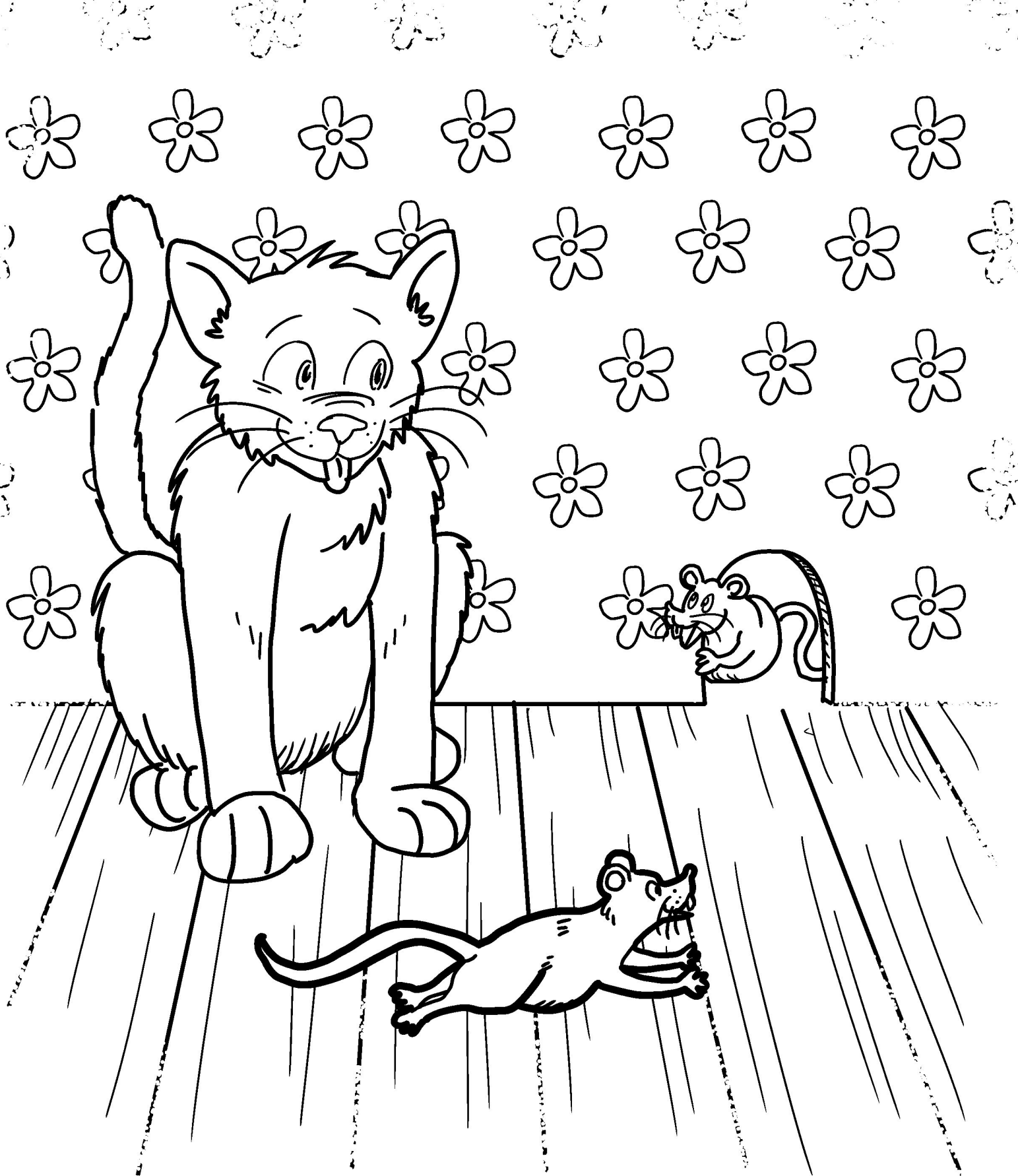
**Some animals work to entertain us.
